- e. Fundraising (not active this year)

- f. Garden Coordinators (Parminder / Diane)
 - Parminder and Diane signed up as Garden Coordinators, which gives them access to Just Food's Food Chat network.
- g. Membership (Barbara with support from Patrick)
 - Barbara wishes to create a sub-committee tasked with recruiting members amongst low income neighbours for the sliding scale plots.
 - Parminder will reach out to Cornerstone; her neighbour works in Social Services and could make recommendations. Wabana Centre is another possibility.
- h. Pollinator Garden Liaison (Hazel with support from Diane): nothing to report for now.
- i. Properties (Andrew)
 - The lining under the roof of the small shed has cracked. One solution is to seal the roof and add a gutter attachment (\$100-200). Another is to build another roof on top of the existing one, as a canopy but might need approval from the NCC before proceeding.
- j. Treasurer's report (Tanya)
 - No expenditures since the last report. She recommends that the \$2,300 in Special Projects be transferred to the reserve fund, bringing it to \$7,000 which is enough to cover our maintenance needs.
 - Recommends renting the Goldenrod plots in 2024 for \$60, while they might rent for \$40 at Bullman due to a late start of the season. She predicts an operating shortfall this year as \$2,000 might be required to purchase seating and tools for Bullman while income from that garden is not assured. The garden has been operating in a surplus for three years so this deficit is reasonable and will be covered by the Special Projects Fund build up over past years.
 - Tanya will prepare scenarios about different plot fees to be discussed at the next meeting.
 - GCG will be making a donation to Parkdale Food Centre from fees paid in excess of the required \$10 for the sliding scale plots that couldn't be assigned to low income neighbors for 2023.
- k. President's report (Sara)
 - Sara will talk to Richcraft for clarification on the size of the plots, how many there might be, and the opening date.
 - She asked Just Food to confirm with the NCC to see if we can continue to garden at the Goldenrod site this summer as the lease will expire in April, Just Food will get back to her.
